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ANNUAL RUMMAGE SALE

JUNE 1, 2013

It is that time of year again!!! Please put on your Rummage Sale hats and commence with the traditional Spring Clearing and Sorting. With the support of the

entire congregation, the Worship and Arts committee is able to put on a spectacular sale each year that supports many beautification projects around the church. This year the dates of the sale are as follows: **Drop off** – Sunday, June 9 from 12 noon-3:00 p.m.; Monday, June 10 & Tuesday, June 11, from 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. **Set up** – Wednesday, June 12, from 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. Church family pre-sale – Wednesday, June 13, from 5:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. (No drop off on Wednesday, please) SALE – Thursday, June 13 & Friday June 14, 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. and Saturday, June 15, 8:00 a.m.-10:00 a.m.. Saturday is a bag sale with clean-up immediately following. The church is arranged into a giant super-store with many different departments; including men's, women's and children's clothing and furnishings, housewares, books, toys and games, sporting goods, furniture..... NO car seats, cribs, tires, gasoline engine operated tools, computer equipment or TV's can be accepted. Please plan to support this project by donation and/or shopping and by volunteering. We are looking forward to another successful sale. Thank you for your support.

SPECIAL FATHER'S DAY OFFERING

As you know, Mother's Day was designated "Blanket Sunday". On Father's Day, you will have the opportunity to give a donation to another Church World Service Project called "Tools of Hope." These tools can make a major difference in the daily life - and the future - of parents and children alike. For example, in African nations where rainfall is erratic, families are learning about gardening for dryseason food production, and are receiving garden tools, along with a concrete-lined well and a water pump for irrigation, and fencing to protect their garden from wandering animals. Church World Service provides locally-made weaving looms, treadle sewing machines, blacksmith anvils and tools, carpentry tools, fishing nets, and gardening tools to schools where training is then provided on how to use these tools. Tools of Hope also supplies roofs for schools, clean water systems, teaching supplies, and teacher training. In the U.S., families reeling in the wake of natural disasters are also receiving help. So why not give a donation in honor or memory of your father, grandfather, or other loved one on Father's Day? Special offering envelopes will be in the Sunday morning bulletin on June 16th. Be sure to write down in whose honor or memory you are giving the donation. A list of those gifts will appear in the bulletin the following week.

Why are we spending so much money on renovations with a shortfall in the budget?

Why are we spending so much money on renovations? That is a good question and deserves an answer. Let's look at each project individually.

Fellowship hall/Kitchen floor. The floor took a beating when the new addition was built in 2010. It has chips in the tile and the joint lines in the kitchen are difficult to clean. About twice a year we have the floor stripped, waxed and buffed. The cost of doing the floor is about \$800 each time it is done. The new floor will be stained concrete with a heavy wax that should not need to be re-waxed for about 5 years saving money on maintenance. The cost is being paid by church members that have a connection to the company doing the work. They made a type of barter for the work. Bottom line the floor will not cost the church a dime!

Prayer Room. This project converted a musty storage room into useful room. Supplies such as paint, drywall, plaster etc. was covered by the generous donation of Home Depot gift cards from Larry and Marilyn Gaskins. The primer was leftover from the building addition. Dave McCloud who is a professional drywall installer provided all his labor free to the church. Behind the wood paneling was a rock foundation with no insulation so we paid for spray foam insulation on the west wall and bat insulation on the north wall. During demolition we decided to insulate the east wall. The supplier did the east wall for no additional charge. Larry Royster and his grandson updated the electrical to bring it up to code and make it safe. Their bill was very reasonable. We did pay to have the HVAC wiring moved inside the wall instead of being exposed. All the wood used in the kneeler was recycled from the old paneling. Larry Ahlborn had the cross and flame done at no cost to the church. The new carpet and all the new furniture was paid for by Worship and the Arts from funds from previous rummage sales. *The total for cost to the church came in about \$1000*.

Shalom Room. Again the cost of all the materials including 2X4's, drywall, paint, trim, doors, hardware etc. was all covered by Home Depot gift cards donated by Larry and Marilyn Gaskins. Dave McCloud did the drywall work. Worship and the Arts is doing the decorative painting and is paying for supplies and providing the labor. They also paid for new Formica on the countertop from funds raised at the rummage sale. Due to the dust created during construction the carpet will be cleaned for an estimated cost of under \$100. **Landscaping/brick walk**. This project is being competed by selling bricks; memorials that cannot be used for the general budget and by volunteer labor. Special thanks to Tim Hauxwell for providing a good portion of the labor.

New Cabinetry. New cabinetry in the narthex, by the office and the moveable unit outside the Fellowship Hall were planned by Worship and the Arts and paid for by funds earned at rummage sales.

The bottom line for all the work being done to freshen up the church is that it is being done through special donations of people's time and money at very minimal cost to the church. The Worship and the Arts, Trustees and your Administrative Board are all working very hard to be good stewards of all church funds and still maintain programs and the facility. The General Fund supports our building utilities, staff salaries, program supplies and other operating expenses of church ministries. The Mortgage Fund pays down the debt on our buildings.

Thank you for your continuing faithful giving to both of these funds to ensure our vital presence and service in this community.

May 16th-19th was the 45th annual session of the Detroit Annual Conference at Adrian College in Adrian, Michigan. For those who may not be aware of what Annual Conference is, it is a yearly gathering of the clergy and lay representatives from each of the churches in the Detroit Conference. (The Detroit Conference comprises the eastern half of Michigan's Lower Peninsula and all of the Upper Peninsula.) This gathering includes vibrant worship, guest preachers and presenters, action on legislation, ordination of new deacons and elders, celebration of retiring pastors, and a memorial remembrance for members of the Conference who passed away in the previous year. This year's Conference was particularly meaningful for me, with stellar presentations from Rev. Adam Hamilton (from Church of the Resurrection, our denomination's largest congregation), the celebration of Rev. Marge's retirement, and my father (as the spouse of my Deacon mother) being remembered as part of our memorial observance

This last Annual Conference was also my first since coming to Lake Orion, so many of my friends and colleagues were asking about my first year here. You'll be glad to know I spared no superlatives in giving LOUMC rave reviews! I related to folks just how well my family and I have been received here, how marvelous our staff is, how vital our ministry is, and how generous our congregation is in spirit and in resources. As I boasted (far more than is probably befitting of a Christian pastor!), it occurred to me that *you all* needed to know just how blessed I feel to be here. This is a special family and faith community, and I feel extremely privileged to be here to help lead you in ministry.

In this issue of the LINK, you will also read an important article from Ralph Reseigh and our Trustees that both celebrates the many improvements we are seeing to our church facility and explains how generosity, hard work, and creative stewardship have brought these things into fruition. The giving nature of our people is so apparent! While we have certainly needed to be diligent in terms of our financial resources, I have never been overly anxious, because it is obvious that God has given us an abundance of good people and good gifts!

Our latest Treasurer's Report brings with it some good news: what had been a \$30,000 shortfall has been reduced to \$16,000! Whenever there is a call, LOUMCers respond! To help us with the consistency of our giving throughout the summer (when many of us are understandably taking needed vacation time), we are encouraging the use of EFT (electronic funds transfer) giving. It is a way to set up your regular giving on auto pay through your bank. It enables you to give even when you can't be here -- and to actually listen to the choir during the offering, instead of fumbling with wallets, purses, checkbooks, or envelopes! For your convenience, we will be putting EFT forms on the SCRIP table in Fellowship Hall and also making them accessible on our church website. If you have questions about the forms, or how EFT works, please feel free to call Cheryl Kelly in the office; she will be glad to help you. Cheryl shared with us at Staff meeting recently that EFT giving went a long way toward steadying the finances at Clarkston UMC where she attends.

In the mean time, as we kick into summer, be sure and be with us to celebrate Graduation (6/2), our Wedding Vow renewal service (also 6/2), Father's Day (6/16), Pastor Marge's last Sunday (6/23), and the 140th anniversary of our church building being moved to this site (6/30). What a month of June! And as soon as we've moved through June, we will be welcoming our new Associate Pastor, John Ball. It is surely an exciting time to be at the church with "A Heart for Christ in the Heart of the Village!" God's blessings to you all, and see you in church!
