Palm / Passion Sunday March 29th 8:00, 9:15, and 11:00

Holy Week begins with children waving palm branches and crowds shouting, "Hosanna! Hosanna to the King!" But then events quickly turn as what began looking like a coronation for Jesus becomes his crucifixion.



Holy Thursday - April 2nd - 7:30

At Jesus' Last Supper, he tells his disciples that one of them will betray him. Our service this evening will feature a re-enactment of the Last Supper based on DaVinci's painting of the same name. Each disciple will share his reaction to Jesus. Holy Communion will be served by the disciples to the congregation.

Good Friday - April 3rd - 7:30 - LOUMC

Darkness came when they crucified Jesus. Our evening service will begin in the darkness, move through the message of the cross, and send us forth with a reminder of God's sacrificial love for us revealed in Jesus.

Good Friday Prayer Vigil

Prayer is the lifeline of the faith community. One of the ways that members of our congregation observe Holy Week and the Passion of our Christ is through our Good Friday Prayer Vigil, which will begin on *Friday, April 3rd at noon and continue until noon on Saturday*. By individ-

ually signing up for a half hour each, we try to cover the whole 24 hour time frame with our prayers, meditations, music, and reading of the scriptures and other devotionals. You can participate in our vigil at your home, at church, or wherever you choose.

Throughout Lent, we have been focusing on our church's involvement in several missions: Love in the Name of Christ, CROP Walk for Hunger, Reverse Church in Pontiac, and Mission Guatemala. We ask that you include these ministries in your prayers

Does Human Trafficking Occur in Michigan?

Did you know that Michigan ranks No. 2 for human trafficking sex trade behind only Nevada? In an effort to crack down on adults and juveniles abducted and used as sex slaves, Gov. Rick Snyder has announced a new team, the Human Trafficking Commission, to fight this crime. Besides apprehending the traffickers, this team will also focus on helping the victims.

How does human trafficking begin? A lot of times it's by trick and coercion. Traffickers look for vulnerable individuals who are lonely or have low self-esteem, sometimes from broken homes or with other problems. They especially target those who have run away from home. They befriend them, gain their trust, sometimes get them drunk or hooked on drugs. They take them away from the vicinity of their homes so they have nowhere to go.

Shopping malls are lucrative sites for traffickers. Our own Great Lakes Crossing has been used by traffickers. Another danger zone is the internet. Even legitimate internet sites like Craigslist feature services which may use human trafficking. Investigators comb through sites like those to identify potential suspects.

Lake Orion United Methodist Church is concerned and wants to join in the fight to stop this crime. The Princess Party with a Purpose is a fundraiser for Esthers' Children, which fights trafficking in Recife, Brazil. In upcoming weeks and months, we will turn our attention to what is happening right here in our area. Just know that it is out there, educate yourself and your family, and be safe.

HAVE YOU MET THE PENNY JUG?

You may have seen the "Penny Jug" sitting on the counter near the coffee mugs each Sunday morning in the Fellowship Hall and wondered, "what in the world is



that thing for?" Well the Penny Jug has been sitting there quietly for 11 years now, and she loves your spare change and she puts it to good use. Over those 11 years, the \$2392.50 she has collected has been evenly divided between two wonderful projects...the Red Bird Mission in Beverly, Kentucky, where several of our congregation has worked to help the local people with home repairs and "No More Malaria" which provides treated bed nets to help guard against that awful disease. Feeding the Penny Jug is fun plus you are helping people both here in Appalachia and in faraway Africa.

Is Climate Change Real?

On Monday, April 20th at 7:00 p.m., you are invited to attend a viewing of the 2012 documentary film *Chasing Ice* in Room 104. Acclaimed environmental photographer James Balog heads to Greenland, Iceland and Alaska in order to capture images that will help to convey the effects of global warming. Balog was initially skeptical about climate change when the issue entered scientific discussion, but after his first trip north, he becomes convinced of the impact that humans have on the planet and becomes committed to bringing the story to the public.

Within months of the first trip to Iceland, Balog initiates The Extreme Ice Survey - an expedition to collect data on the seasonal changes of glaciers. Balog and his team deploy cameras that utilize time-lapse photography across various places in the Arctic to capture a multi-year record of the world's glaciers.

After being plagued by numerous technical problems and health issues, Balog and his team are finally able to collect time-lapse photos that depict the drastic erosion and disappearance of enormous, ancient glaciers. Length of the documentary is 75 minutes. This showing is sponsored by the United Methodist Women's Circle of Hope, and is open to everyone.
