

What is Lent?

Lent is an important season in the Church's year. Every year Christians use Lent to prepare themselves for the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, on Easter Sunday.



When is Lent?

Lent is the forty days before Easter Christians do not include Sundays in the forty days because they celebrate Jesus' resurrection every Sunday. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday.

Shrove Tuesday refers to the day before **Ash Wednesday**, the first day of the season of Lent. It remembers a tradition of clearing all leavened products from the home for Lent, just as Jewish households often clear their homes of leaven in preparation for Passover.

The word *shrove* is the past tense of the English verb, *shrive*, which means to obtain absolution for one's sins by way of confession and doing penance. Thus, Shrove Tuesday gets its name from the shriving that Christians were expected to do prior to receiving absolution before Lent. Shrove Tuesday is the last day of "shrovetide", somewhat analogous to the *Carnival* tradition that developed separately in countries of Latin Europe.

The term "Shrove Tuesday" is not widely used in the United States outside of liturgical traditions, such as the Lutheran, Episcopal, and Roman Catholic Churches, though it has come back into usage with many United Methodist and other mainline Protestant denominations. Because of the increase in immigrant populations and traditions within the United States since the 19th century, the term "Mardi Gras" is more widely known and used.

This festival is widely associated with the eating of foods such as pancakes, and often known simply as **Pancake Day**, originally because these used up ingredients such as fat and eggs, the consumption of which was traditionally restricted during Lent. In Michigan, especially in the Hamtramck area near Detroit with its large Polish community, the day is celebrated as Pączki Day with pączki eating contests, music, and Polish food.

What will we clean from the cluttered cupboards of our lives for Lent?

What burdens that clutter our hearts and saddle our souls will we get rid of? Will we use Lent as an opportunity to "shrive" – to make amends with God, and with one another, in order to know God's peace and pardon?

In the Old Testament, ashes were sprinkled over the head or body to show penance for sin and disobedience, and a desire to repent before God.

Placing ashes (made from the burned palms from the previous Palm Sunday) on the forehead of penitent Christians became a common practice in the 12th century. Even though many Protestant churches stopped using ashes during the Reformation, many denominations have returned to this humbling reminder: "... for dust you are, and to dust you will return." (Genesis 3:19).

In receiving a cross of ashes on our forehead, we acknowledge that we are in need of God's mercy and forgiveness, and that we hope in God's unfailing love demonstrated through the life, teaching, ministry, and sacrifice of Jesus.



Volunteer in the Spotlight: Kathy Castillo



Kathy has been attending LOUMC for about 4 years now, and is involved in several different groups. She is the Blood Drive Coordinator, and has been doing that for the last 3 or so years. She delivers meals each Monday for Community Meals to her friends at Heritage Place. She cochairs the Angel Tree project with Sue Montgomery, and is on the Mission Committee. Kathy is the Lead for our Church Financials Audit this year, and serves on the Finance Committee. She is

both an usher and a Communion Steward. She says that each of these diverse opportunities to serve came about because someone recognized that she was willing, and had skills for that particular job.

Growing up on a farm in a small community in the Thumb, Kathy saw her neighbors and family helping each other. It was a way of life; if you were able to help, you just did. She enjoys seeing the appreciation for what she does on the faces of the people she encounters. The people who coordinate the Angel Tree project each year were so excited to see Kathy and Sue pull up in an SUV packed with gifts for their clients! The Heritage Place residents all expect to see her each week, and if she is not going to be there, she has to let them know ahead of time, or they worry about her! They say she is their 'ray of sunshine' each week – and who wouldn't love being known for that!

It's interesting to connect with people in the different missions that you wouldn't necessarily see each week in church, Kathy says. There is an opportunity to engage with people you didn't know before. There are so many ways to volunteer and participate in short-lived projects. Not all commitments are long term. She encourages people to find one in an area of interest, with a manageable time frame. Start small if you want. But don't miss out on an opportunity to be someone's 'ray of sunshine'.

Music has been an important part of our church history. While no record gives a definite date for the first choir, we are led to believe it started with the early church. An entry in 1896 records mentions a "Singing School" held for ten nights with two classes for different age levels. Early choirs were led by volunteer directors who were dedicated persons who donated their time and talent as have many people who have sung in our choirs throughout the years. A pipe organ was purchased in 1905 and many benefits were held to pay for it. For many years this organ was powered by air, provided by an older boy whose duty it was to stay awake and keep pumping. It is a

matter of record that there were a few times when he may have dozed off, much to the consternation of the organist and amusement of the congregation.




