## From the Pastor's Desk



Some years it has been difficult, in the middle of Lent, to "shift gears" and to write an Easter letter. This year has been an exception. Part of the reason it is less difficult this year is our current worship theme of Spirituals. While the spirituals all recognize the heaviness of the Black experience, a heaviness appropriate to the Lenten season, each one of them also contains some sort of revolutionary twist, some sort of imaginative tweaking of the story that lifts up hope in the midst of the heavy. Janice mentioned to me a couple of weeks ago that the more traditionally Lenten, somewhat somber postludes (music after the service) that she had originally chosen to play really didn't fit with the spirit of the services – so at the last minute she played music that was brighter instead, unexpected notes of Easter! It reminded me that while the liturgical calendar lists Sundays of Advent, it lists Sundays in Lent. The Sundays of Advent contain Advent; they wait for Christmas. But the Sundays in Lent do not contain Lent. In fact, they are not actually counted as part of the 40 days of Lent. Rather they are little insertions of resurrection day - Easter - into the calendar. The spirituals sneak little bits of Glory Hallelujah praise in between the days

It is also easier writing an Easter letter to you this year because of the signs of new life I see all around us in our congregation. After a lengthy season of decline and dismay, and of the disconnectedness with which COVID plagued us, I can practically hear the stone rolling away from the mouth of the tomb! There is a lightness among us, a growing spirit, a renewed energy to reconnect with one another to connect across the generations in new and intentional ways. Staff is revitalized with the addition of Rev. Linda Cochran to our

of penitence. And we are better off for it.

Intergenerational Ministry efforts. Small groups are thriving. Worship is blossoming. And collectively we are rededicating ourselves to LOUMC's uniquely missional identity. Don't get me wrong; there is still a TON of work to be done. But it is a joyful work, and a work with which we are blessed. A work that, embarked on together with the Spirit as our guide, we can do.

Lastly, another reason this Easter letter is easier to write this year, is that for the first time since I have been here at LOUMC, our Finance team and Church Council have developed and approved a budget which actually matches up with the amount of money we took in last year. Moreover, last year's giving (for the first time in a while) actually exceeded the giving from the previous year. As I ask for your generous giving in the Easter season, I can do so feeling better than ever about the wise stewardship of our resources. Again, this is no reason to rest on our laurels - or to bury our one talent in the ground, playing it safe; there is plenty more ministry to do, mission to live, and monies to give. But we can be grateful that we are in a place of greater financial freedom and stability, less inhibited by anxiety and fear for the future. So please, as you think about your personal blessings and the collective blessing that this congregation is to you, to the entirety of our faith community, and to the broader community of Lake Orion and beyond, give with glad and generous hearts as you are able.



### Donate Pill Bottles

UMW are recycling used pill bottles.
This is an easy way to help people in need.
They can be dropped off by the office or fellowship hall. Thank you for your help!



Matthew 25: Ministries accepts donations of empty plastic pill bottles for inclusion in shipments of medical supplies. Pill bottle program fulfills the dual needs of improving medical care in developing countries and caring for our environment.

### Acceptable collection items include:

- Prescription and over-the-counter pill bottles
- Large and small pill bottles
- Pill Bottles with and without secure caps (child resistant)

Pill bottles that are not appropriate to include with shipments of medical supplies are recycled for cash that goes towards Matthew 25: Ministries' programs. If you wish to prepare bottles for shipment rather than recycling, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Bottles included in shipments of medical supplies must have an all plastic lid.
- Remove labels, leaving no glue or residue.
- Wash bottles in very hot water and dish soap.
- Rinse and dry thoroughly.
- Replace lids on clean, dried bottles.
- Put in plastic bags to keep them clean.



# Memorial Walk and Garden

Ten years ago, in celebration of LOUMC's 140th Anniversary, a memory garden/walk was created. The memory walk includes engraved bricks that honor the memory of departed family and friends. The cost of each 8" x 4" brick is \$50, which includes the lettering (14 spaces/3 lines) and placement in the memory walk.
