We will be printing historical info about our church for our 150th Anniversary celebration all through 2022.

In 1872, during the pastorate of Rev. Cordon, work was begun on the structure that we still use today. It was built on two lots located on Flint and Lapeer streets that were purchased for the sum of \$200. This site was later to become the location of the MC Railroad station and more recently, Auto Zone.

The cornerstone was laid June 20, 1872 by Rev. Seth Reed, the presiding elder. Philo Van Wagoner donated the laying of the wall for the foundation with stone drawn at a work bee May 9th and lime brought from Pontiac. The frame was raised on July 20th. The basement was dedicated on December 11th of the same year. Members were asked to sacrifice and the money was raised to complete the church the following summer at a cost of about \$7,000. A Dr. Ives of New York dedicated the church on June 14th, 1874.

Volunteer in the Spotlight: Ardis Pearce

I was born and raised in the Lake Orion community and graduated from LOHS in 1963. As a high school student I was involved in Methodist Youth Fellowship along with many friends even though I did not attend this church. I was also a member of the East Orion 4 -H group. The people of those two groups overlapped a great deal. Those two groups taught me very early in life



that helping others was part of life. I was raised on a small farm and knew the importance of hard work and that work was easier when you had help. After college I taught at Saint Joseph Catholic School in Lake Orion which also gave me volunteer experiences. When Jim and I were first married, we joined the Lake Orion Jaycees – another volunteer group. It allows me to feel that I am able to do as much as I can, whenever I can, and as often as I can. I feel complete and faithful. There are many opportunities at LOUMC for volunteers. Sunday mornings are just the beginning. This church is in the heart of a wonderful community that loves and depends on us. It takes everyone in their own way to do God's work.


