
Euchre Anyone???

The purpose of a Hunger Banquet is to simulate the imbalanced distribution of food

in our world and the randomness of being born into poverty. Children born into poverty do not "choose" to be poor yet the majority of these children will not rise above poverty in their lifetime. Their chances of escaping poverty is even less likely if they are a woman or a minority. In Youth Café on September 30th, the youth participated in a Hunger Banquet. They learned that being born into a different socioeconomic status can affect the health, learning, education opportunities and exposure to crime that you may experience growing up and how that then affects potential outcomes as an adult.

The groups were randomly assigned to one of three groups: Lake Orion, Warren, or Detroit. We compared household income, housing costs and options, crime statistics, and high school free and reduced lunch percentages. Then finally we looked at math and reading proficiencies and graduation rate. Access to nutritional food, potential for lead exposure or unsafe environments, and stability in the home all affect a child's ability to learn and thrive in the education system. This then begins a downward spiral that is difficult to stop. Our discussion was AWESOME and hopefully gave the youth a different perspective on poverty as a systemic issue with no simple fix.

Speak Up

Following up on my August article about Ruthie Taylor and her ministry of inviting others to come to church with her, I want to share with you this month some revealing and disturbing statistics regarding evangelism. George Barna, generally regarded to be the dean of church statisticians, found in one of his surveys that only 35% of Christians believe they have a responsibility to spread the good news of new life in Christ by sharing their faith with others. That leaves 65% who don't believe they have that responsibility; and I think it's safe to say not even all of the 35% actually do it.

In Mark's Gospel, Jesus several times instructs his disciples to "tell no one." In its original context, that apparently has to do with timing; but someone has noted that that's the one commandment most Christians have perpetually kept. Barna's is not the only survey to reveal that, when it comes to talking with others about their faith, Christians are remarkably closed-mouthed. Even such a simple, yet potentially lifegiving, act as inviting a friend or family member to church seems to take more courage than many people can muster.


Yet there are just as many surveys indicating that people who are not yet involved in a church are quite open to being invited and that "pre-Christians" are at least interested—and often eager—when it comes to talking with you about your faith. One man reported, with some embarrassment, a conversation he had with a golfing buddy after he told him that he couldn't play on a Sunday morning because he would be at church. The man said, "I don't know what that church of yours is all about, but you sure do keep it to yourself. I don't know how many times I've invited

you to go golfing on Sunday, but you've never once invited me to go to church!"

The Alban Institute surveyed newcomers in 22 congregations across the country, asking among other things, "What brought you to this church?" Eighty-six percent said they were invited by a friend or family member. The lesson is pretty obvious. The field is ripe for harvest (John 4:35); and the Bible's promise is that the Holy Spirit goes before us to prepare the way, and within us to give us the words to speak. All we have to do is seize the moment and open our mouths.
