An Announcement from Rev. John Hice, East Winds District Superintendent

Dear members of the East Winds District and friends in Christ.

Bishop David Bard, the Michigan Cabinet, and the Michigan Conference Board of Ordained Ministry have granted my request for retirement, effective July 1, 2023.

The wonder of God's call to ordained ministry has shaped my life, from Christ's first working in my heart as a young child, to my long struggle of resistance, my discernment and acceptance, and my journey through the decades that followed. I am a child of the Detroit Conference, nurtured in the womb of Dearborn: First Methodist Church. Their first step of recognizing call from God in 1975 was, in itself, an act of grace. My theological and pastoral skills were sharpened by the gifted faculty and students of Garret-Evangelical Theological Seminary.

Deacon's Ordination for Probationary Membership (under the old, two-step ordination process for elders) under the hand of Bishop Dwight Loder in 1976 was for me, a moment of empowerment. Elder's Ordination for Full Membership by the hand of Bishop Edsel Ammons imposed a weight of responsibility which I have ever felt. Appointments to local congregations and districts have each been valuable gifts which have formed my spirit. It has been a joy to serve, an incredible honor.

I turned 70 in May 2022. I will be 71 on my requested retirement date. I look forward to enjoying more time with my wife, Laura, who has been my confidant, consultant, and partner throughout this ministry journey. Retirement will not mark the end of ministry, but a turning in life's tempo and more specific focus.

Serving you on the East Winds District has been a privilege and blessing. The spirit of Methodism enlivens you: it makes you an incredible people who love God and knws that God loves you. You have inspired me in your worship, your study and prayer, the love of your fellowship, and the passion of your witness and mission. What an honor it is to serve you. It is not easy to step aside from appointive ministry when I have this privilege to serve with you!

Thank you for sharing your life and ministry with me. It is a precious and God-sent gift.



Volunteer in the Spotlight – Trudy Carney

"I always get more than I give"

Trudy Carney has been a 'forever' member of LOUMC. Her parents were married in our church, and she was born in Lake Orion and baptized here. She has witnessed many transformations over the years, noting a significant growth in how the youth are represented now than when she grew up. She's thankful for the experience she and her children have had at LOUMC.

Volunteering at LOUMC has become integral to Trudy's life. After retirement from Crittenden Development Corporation, Trudy chose to share more of her many talents and time with the church, giving her a greater purpose and opportunity to engage more deeply with others. Over the years, she became involved in more than eight (8) different ministries, including:

- Membership Secretary 10+ years. Trudy is the one who keeps track of attendance, baptisms, memberships, etc. and publishes reports that are shared annually with the Conference.
- Finance Committee 15+ years. A member of this committee, Trudy focuses on the memorial fund, budgeting and endowment subcommittee.
- Usher it's a rare Sunday not to see Trudy's smiling face (even through the masks!) greeting new and oldcomers alike. "Ushering, in particular, is meaningful to me. I love greeting people when they arrive for service, especially new people. We never know what baggage others are bringing with them so it's so important to just be friendly to people."
- SCRIP 12+ years. Trudy, together with Sharon Keener, has raised over \$35,000 through this program, all to benefit special projects that help

keep our church safe and welcoming. Money from Scrip has helped activities like Worship and the Arts (among other things, Scrip funding enabled the purchases of the green carpet in the sanctuary), Conference mission annual projects like Haiti Hot Lunch program and this year Ukraine. Scrip



money has also provided funds for the Community Assistance Fund, Music Program and Prayers and Squares over the years.

Community Meals – 10 years. Trudy is one of the weekly rotating Lead Coordinators. The person in this role decides what meal will be served, determines and orders groceries, and directs the many helpers who make this community meal possible through donations of time and money.

Worship and the Arts – over 15 years. As a member of this team, Trudy helps decorate the Altar to reflect the various seasons and events of the church. In addition, she works on projects to make our church more welcoming.

In addition to the above, Trudy pitches in whenever and wherever she can, including Vacation Bible School, Project Shalom, 'back-up' Secretary, and more.

Trudy loves the social interactions through these ministries, thankful for the opportunities volunteering has presented to her to get to know people in ways that are not possible by just attending church: "I always get more than I give".

The first coffee hour was started Sunday, October 17, 1971 and was extremely popular. Currently the coffee hour serves as a fellowship time and allows folks to gather with friends and catch up with news. The adult bible study group gathers in the library after getting their coffee and has ongoing discussions with various hosts.




