




A few more details about "Gathered for Grace Events" Milk and Honey Cooking School


We hope you have marked your calendar for November 1st and November 29th to join with our church family in two special meals. Both events will be unique and have their own theme which I would like to describe further!

Food Donation Ministry for Community Meals

On Sunday, November 26th, as a part of our Come to the Table theme, we will have an ingathering of food items for our Community Meal pantry (see list of requested items on the next page). The scripture that morning is Acts 11:1-15, where Peter and Cornelius (a Roman centurion) have been improbably brought together by God's Spirit in table fellowship. Part of what brought them together was a vision given to Peter:

He saw the heaven opened and something like a large sheet coming down, being lowered to the ground by its four corners. In it were all kinds of four-footed creatures and reptiles and birds of the air. Then he heard a voice saying, "Get up, Peter; kill and eat." But Peter said, "By no means, Lord; for I have never eaten anything that is profane or unclean." The voice said to him again, a second time, "What God has made clean, you must not call profane."

As our own visual for that morning, we will have a sheet on the chancel (in front of the altar) where you will be invited to leave your offerings of food. We hope to have a grand display of our congregation's generosity and a visual reminder of our commitment to our Community Meal and the fellowship and service it provides.

COMMUNITY MEALS ANNUAL FUNDRAISER AND FOOD COLLECTION

Community Meals currently provides 140 meals Monday nights from 5:30 to 6:00 pm. These meals are provided through donation of money and food. Currently, with the increased cost of food and packaging, the cost of providing meals is an average \$375 a night.

Lake Orion Lighted Christmas Parade and LOUMC


On December 3rd, come and watch the Christmas parade from the comfort of our church! We will provide hot cocoa, cookies, a place to stay warm.

HOW TO MAKE CHARITABLE GIFTS WITH AN IRA

For IRA owners that are 70.5 or older, an easy way to make the donation and get a tax break is by making a qualified charitable donation (QCD) from a traditional IRA. The tax break only applies if you're 70.5 or older on the date of the charitable transfer. The maximum allowed is \$100,000 per year of the total IRA balance. There are three main tax benefits of a QCD. They are not taxable. The amount donated is not included in your taxable income. This may help mitigate surcharges on your future Medicare premiums. They also count toward your minimum distribution requirement.

Only transfers from the IRA directly to charity are considered a QCD. Most IRA custodians will require you to complete a form detailing the amount of donation and the Name – address of the organization. Usually, the custodian will send the check directly to the charity. It is helpful to contact the charity and let them know "check is in the mail" which can help provide acknowledgement or a receipt. Recognize that you cannot also insert the charitable distribution on Schedule A. That would be double dipping.

Don't wait until the last minute if you are eligible to do this in 2023. It takes a bit more time for this process to occur. The check must be received by the charity by December 31.

The 1099-R you receive early next year won't reflect the QCD. The 1099-R will only show the total amount of distributions from the IRA during the year. When filling out the tax return during tax season, you include the total distribution on line 4a of the 1040. Then subtract the QCD amount and report the remainder, even if zero, on line 4b and insert "QCD" next to line 4b. If tax software is used for the return preparation, the QCD will automatically be printed on the form.




