This year I have been aided in my own journey by the musical writing project I've begun, and that I mentioned in last week's (1/14) sermon. I have rendered poetically the parallels between the story of the Binding of Isaac (see Genesis 22) and the story of Jesus in a text (becoming a song) called **Children of Promise**. I've shared the text with you below. May you find it a blessing as you shift gears, preparing for Lent and for the lengthening of days.

Charge Conference - a brief Charge Conference Meeting will be held immediately after the 9:15 am service on Sunday, February 11, 2018 in the sanctuary. This required meeting is scheduled for the membership to vote on the refinancing of the Orbit Street This meeting is necessary due to the expiration of the current mortgage and the ability to obtain a new mortgage at a lower interest rate.

**Financial Update** - The finance committee is grateful for the generous responses of so many of you to our plea for additional giving in 2017! Thanks to you (and to those of you who contribute so generously on a regular basis), LOUMC was able to end 2017 in the black. However, we did not meet 100% of what the United Methodist Church asks from us annually in apportionments (monies used to support the denomination, its infrastructure, and ministries). This is something we hope to improve upon in the coming year.

You should have received by now, or be receiving soon, a Financial Commitment Letter for 2018. It is our hope to communicate early, regularly, and well, the financial needs of LOUMC in order to fully fund our mission and ministry. Please watch for that letter, and prayerfully consider your financial commitment (as well as your other commitments of prayers, presence, witness, and service) to the life of LOUMC this year.

Please also take note of the other financial articles in this issue of the LINK regarding electronic giving, the need for financial review (audit) volunteers, and the upcoming Church Conference where we will approve a refinancing of the Orbit Street Parsonage, through the Michigan Area Loan Fund of the United Methodist Church, in order to get better terms than the bank offers.


