DISCIPLE BIBLE STUDY


Beginning this fall, LOUMC will be offering DISCIPLE Bible Study classes. From the input we've received, it looks we have enough interest to offer two classes: one on Monday evening from 7:00 to 8:30, and one on Tuesday morning from 10:00 to 11:30. We will be meeting in Room 120 (the room off of the Fellowship Hall), and Pastor Larry will be leading the classes.


DISCIPLE is a long-term commitment. There are 33 weeks of classes, and daily readings from the Bible as well as a Study Manual.

But it is well worth the effort! As well as a great deal of learning, what people most often share about their DISCIPLE experience is the close fellowship that is built between the members of the group. While there are multiple DISCIPLE studies, both of these sessions will be from the first DISCIPLE series which encompasses the entire Bible over the 33 week period. I would invite anyone who thinks they might be interested, but are afraid of the commitment, to attend the first two weeks just to try it out. At that point, if it's not for you, feel free to drop out, no questions asked. What a deal! I'm guessing, though, that after two weeks you will be hooked!

Our first sessions will be held the week of September 18th (Monday the 19th and Tuesday the 20th). We have the books already available if you'd like to have yours prior to the first session, but it is OK to get your book at that first session. The books cost \$40, though if that is a financial hardship don't let it stop you. Couples are free to share, but since there is space for taking notes in each book, each individual having a book is a plus.

The first three Sundays of September, there will be the opportunity to sign up for one of the DISCIPLE sessions on the Connection Card. You can also call the church office or contact Pastor Larry directly to register.

BIG NEWS FROM THE SCRIP PROGRAM

We now have additional ways you can purchase gift cards from Scrip.

Here are the ways:

Purchase at the Scrip table like we have done in the past either by purchasing from the inventory we have on hand or making an order and we will have them the next week.

Purchase online, order online or refill cards purchased thru Lake Orion United Methodist Church Scrip Program online. To do this create a Shop with Scrip account. Go to www.ShopWithScrip.com and click on "How to Enroll" and next click on "Join Your Scrip Program." You will need to enter our Enrollment Code 79A6B19F4366. Fill in the required information and click "Register." Pay for your scrip gift cards that you order online with PrestoPay, the convenient payment system available on ShopWithScrip.com. When you use PrestoPay, your order payment is transferred securely via electronic debt. PrestoPay is not a credit card system, but rather a debit system to your specified account. Register for PrestoPay via logging on to your ShopWithScrip account, click on the PrestoPay link under Family Functions on your Dashboard, and enter your checking account information. Complete the steps to verify your information, and you will receive a secure approval code which will need to be given to Trudy Carney (trudycarney@aol.com). THAT'S IT!!!!! You will be able to choose PrestoPay option when you checkout.

Trudy Carney or Sharon Keener can give you details on what is available through the online system and help you. We currently have families using this system and find it so convenient. You can even purchase an online gift card for your immediate use. Home Depot is one these types of cards.

At 9/11 Memorial, an Enduring Message of Forgiveness

Retaliation.

"Ye have heard that it hath been said, An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth: But I say unto you, That

ye resist not evil: but whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also."

So many chapters. So many verses. But these were the words — from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, in the Gospel of Matthew — found permanently exposed at Ground Zero after the Sept. 11 attacks. The pages of the Bible in which they were printed had fused to a chunk of steel as the World Trade Center collapsed, to be found only months later.

The artifact was be shown to Pope Francis when he visited the National September 11 Memorial Museum. It was given to the museum by the photographer Joel Meyerowitz, whose book "Aftermath: World Trade Center Archive" is the definitive pictorial chronicle of the months following the attack.

A firefighter found the fragment in March 2002, under the Tully Road, a temporary truck route that covered the last remnants of the south tower. He called out to the photographer, who happened to be nearby.

"This shredded, burned and rubble-covered Bible came to me from the loving hands of a fireman who knew that I was the record keeper of ground zero," Mr. Meyerowitz said Thursday in an e-mail from Italy, where he now lives.

"My astonishment at seeing the page that the Bible was open to made me realize that the Bible's message survives throughout time," he said, "and in every era we interpret its teachings freshly, as the occasion demands."
