In order to make Blessings in a Brown Bag successful, the program needs many volunteers. Volunteers do not have to commit to every day or even the entire summer. While that would be great, I know that is it not feasible for most of you to commit that much time out of your schedule. I would ask that you prayerfully consider helping as much as you can without getting burned out. However, we did learn last year that consistent volunteers improved efficiency and makes our process go more smoothly!

<u>Start & End Date</u>: Lunches will be prepared and served Monday – Friday from Monday, June 19th through Friday, August 30th. The start date may still change back to June 17th depending upon whether the snow days are forgiven and if the district decides to adjust the calendar.

Number of Children: We are targeting a maximum of 170 children. Completed applications are filtering in, however, the final number may not reach 170. Keep in mind, this does not mean that we will be delivering to 170 homes since multiple children often live at each residence.

<u>Morning Prep Shift:</u> This shift is **Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m.** and will involve making sandwiches (if that is what is on the menu) and packing the lunches in brown bags and putting them in the insulated bags by route.

<u>Afternoon Prep Shift</u>: This time slot is TBD depending upon the number of children we are serving this summer. If we do have this shift, it will run **Sunday through Thursday from Noon – 2:00 p.m.** and will involve prepping food for the next day which includes individually packaging fruit, vegetables, and preparing salads such as coleslaw, macaroni salad, etc. This shift will also get the brown bags counted out, etc. for the next day to speed the packing process.

Delivery: Again, we will not know now many residences until closer to launch date, however, we have committed to delivery between 11:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. Volunteer drivers should arrive at LOUMC between 10:30 a.m. -10:40 a.m. and receive their routing paperwork and insulated bags full of packed lunches. We will group residences as close together as possible to speed the delivery process. Volunteers can commit to one day or multiple days per week. We will also need substitute drivers as well. Volunteer drivers will have to complete a background check form. In addition, drivers need to return to LOUMC to return the insulated bags, route information, and return the cold pack to the freezer. Please keep in mind that we do not want children or youth on delivery routes **Shopping:**

- 1) Pick up bread at Aunt Millie's in White Lake on Saturday's and deliver to church. Volunteer will receive a text by Friday afternoon with weekly order.
- 2) Milk pick up from Gordon's in Rochester Hills. We unfortunately have limited refrigerator space to do a once a week pickup We will need to pick up 2-3 times a week depending upon the number of children.
- 3) Pick up preordered food from Gordon's as needed.

What I need from YOU:

- \Rightarrow Choose what you would like to do.
- \Rightarrow Choose your day or days of the week you would like to commit to.
- \Rightarrow Complete a background form if you want to be a driver.
- \Rightarrow Make sure I have your email and other contact information.

Thank you again for volunteering for this important ministry. I look forward to working with you this summer!


