



Finance Update


Hello fellow supporters of our church! If you were in worship this past Sunday you have already heard me give you an update on the status of the Church's finances so far this year. In case you were unable to attend or if you just want a little more time to actually see and contemplate the information that I showed up on the screens I'll recap my update for you here in the Link. Also, as a reminder you can go to the church website and view prior services as they were recorded in

case you find a verbal update to be easier to follow (check out the beginning of any of the October 1st services for my update).

The first piece to share with you is just an update on the status of the total debt being carried by our church. In preparation for building the wonderful addition we had an awesome capital campaign. That amazing giving enabled us to pay off the prior debt, pay part of the construction costs, and finally to then borrow enough to complete the



building addition. The chart to the right shows what our debt prediction was and where it actually came in. The key point is that as a congregation we did exactly as we said we would and have been faithfully making our mortgage payments such that the total still owed as of the end of August was down to \$1.44 million.



The second piece of my update showed you some information of where each of us give on a yearly basis. In the picture at right you can see that the key supporters of our church give anywhere from \$240 per year up to a high of over \$15,000 per year. The numbers above the bars represent how many families (or individuals) are giving at each of those levels. So as one example, we have 16 families or individuals who are each giving at an annual rate of \$6,000 to \$10,000 per year. The importance of this graphic is to hopefully give

you a better understanding of where your giving falls in relation to what it takes to run our church. Basically, we have about 200 families or individuals that make the ministry happen. This means that the average required giving per family is about \$3,500 per year. Obviously, some folks are not able to give at that level and others are led to give well beyond the average need.

As a congregation we generally prefer not to talk about the financial side of supporting our church, however, it is the very generous giving that has always been at the core of the Lake Orion United Methodist Church. That generosity is what has made amazing ministries possible. I shared during the service that I'm looking forward to volunteering at yet another Project SHALOM next weekend with both my kids working with me on a work team. I was lucky enough to be a high school youth in our church when Pastors Ed Duncan and Mary Margaret Eckhardt began the first Project SHALOM after returning from trips to do outreach work in Tennessee. The fact that this ministry continues after all these years is a testament to the dedication of each of you in a church where ministry truly means being actively engaged in the world around us. Yet Project SHALOM is only a tiny sliver of what your continued support enables.

As mentioned by Pastor Larry on Sunday, we anticipate that some of you may have some questions about where we stand so members of the Finance Committee and the Church Council have volunteered to host an informal sharing time between the 9:15 and 11:00 services for the next two weeks. We will share with you information to help answer questions like, "Where do the offerings that I give get spent?" or "If I feel called to step up my giving, what might that look like?" or "I've heard folks talk about tithing but I want to understand what that might mean for me and my family." I would encourage each of you to stop by even just to say hi. This will be held in the over-flow class room right off the fellowship hall so grab a cup of coffee and a donut and stop in to see us.

I want to close by saying thank you to everyone who continues to support our church through your prayers, your service, and your giving. We are extremely blessed both by those who have come before us and by those who even now are in our midst.






UNITED METHODIST MEN


